5 Ways God Would Tell You to Start the New Year.

good time to start thinking about better relationships and the most important one is with Jesus. God has given us a clean slate to start along with many suggestions as to how we could have better relationships and a better life.

Here are 5 practical ways to begin 2025 following His guidance

1. Begin With Keeping God First in Your Life

One thing to think about as you consider the place of priority God holds in your life is how do you spend your time each week? You have work and relaxation, family and friends, but where is God on your list?

- Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness...(Matthew 6:33)
- Proverbs 3:6 proclaims, "In everything you do, put God first, and he will direct you and crown your efforts with success,"

2. Begin with a Renewed Commitment to the Priority of Prayer

Prayer is our voice to God, our chance to thank Him, praise Him, ask Him for what we need, even complain about our day. Talk to Him, He is a parent who wants to hear from His children.

² My God and King, listen to my prayer. ³ Every morning, Lord, I lay my gifts before you and look to you for help. And every morning you hear my prayers. (Psalm 5:2,3)

3. Begin Without the Nagging Paralyzing Effect of Fear, Dread and Worry

- So do not be afraid. I am with you. Do not be terrified. I am your God. I will make you strong and help you. I will hold you safe in my hands. I always do what is right. (Isa.41:10)
- ⁷ Turn all your worries over to him. He cares about you. (1 Peter 5:7)

4. Begin With Forgiveness for Yourself and for Others.

- ¹⁴ "If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. ¹⁵ But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins. (Matt. 6:14-15)
- ¹³ Make allowance for each other's faults and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. (Colossians 3:13)

5. Begin with The End in Mind.

What do you want the end of 2025 to be like? What do you want to have accomplished, how do

you want to be better? Different? This means you'll need to set and accomplish goals. Here are some ideas on how to do so.

- Commit your actions to the Lord, and your plans will succeed. (Prov. 16:3)
- ³³ Seek the Kingdom of God^[a] above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need. Matt. 6:33

Overall, I think Ephesians 4:32 and Philippians 4:6-7 put it best,

- ³² Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you. (Ephesians 4:32)
- ⁶ Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. ⁷ Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

It's just amazing what the Bible can teach us! Take some time to read it.

They become vulnerable to disease.

Every day millions are exposed to unsanitary conditions that can lead to sickness, even death.

Students are unable to attend school.
